International Maarif Schools Azerbaijan aims to follow the Cambridge Assessment International Education curriculum framework, which includes the Cambridge Primary, Cambridge Lower Secondary, Cambridge Upper Secondary (IGCSE), and Cambridge Advanced (A-Level) stages.

- Cambridge Primary: Aimed at learners aged 5 to 11, focusing on developing skills in English, Mathematics, Science, and Global Perspectives.
- Cambridge Lower Secondary: For learners aged 11 to 14, building on the foundations of the primary stage and preparing students for IGCSE.
- Cambridge Upper Secondary (IGCSE): For learners aged 14 to 16, offering a wide range of subjects that cater to different interests and abilities.
- Cambridge Advanced (AS/A-Level): For learners aged 16 to 19, providing in-depth study in selected subjects, preparing students for higher education and employment.

4. Curriculum Implementation

- Teaching and Learning Approach: Our teaching methods are student-centred, promoting active learning, inquiry, and critical thinking. Teachers use a variety of instructional strategies to meet the diverse needs of students.

will be used at key stages to benchmark student achievement.
